

The Value of Songs and Fingerplays

In your table group, discuss the benefits of singing songs and doing fingerplays with children. List your ideas.

Strategies for Singing Songs and Doing Fingerplays With Children

- 1. Sing songs with simple melodies and repetitive words or phrases.
- 2. Sing songs and do fingerplays that allow children to choose different words and actions.
- 3. Simplify songs and fingerplays (that is, use words and actions that make sense to children).
- 4. Separate the words and actions. Practice the actions first.

Songs to Familiar Tunes

Everybody Follow Joey (tune: "Mary Had A Little Lamb")

(Joey chooses a way to move in place)
Everybody follow Joey, follow Joey, follow Joey.
Everybody follow Joey. He's the leader now.

Now It's Time to Pick Up the Toys (tune: "Mulberry Bush")

Now it's time to pick up the toys, pick up the toys, pick up the toys. Now it's time to pick up the toys, so we can have our lunch.

Everybody Put Your Hands in the Air (tune: "Buffalo Gals")

Everybody put your hands in the air, hands in the air, hands in the air. Everybody put your hands in the air, and say hello to **Rita**. (Rita chooses another body part to hold up and wave.)

Create your own song to a familiar tune:

Building Choice Into Children's Songs

•	Voice quality: Sing with a high voice, then with a low voice. Ask children how a song might
	sound if they sang it with a "mouse voice," a "monster voice," or a "sleepy voice." Ask
	children for other ideas.

♦ Volume: Sing songs loudly, then softly.

♦ Speed (tempo): Sing a song very slowly, then repeat it, singing it a little faster each time.

♦ Words or actions: Create a new version of a favorite song by changing key words or actions.

Examples:

- Change the words of "Wheels on the Bus" to "Wings on the Airplane." Ask children to name other vehicles to sing about.
- Instead of singing "Old MacDonald Had a Farm," sing "Old MacDonald Had a Jungle," or "Old MacDonald Had a Zoo."

(Repeat the song, reducing number of ducks by one each time)

Teaching Songs to Children

Separate: When introducing a song or fingerplay, introduce the motions and review the words separately rather than presenting the motions and words to children at the same time.

Simplify: Use *words* and/or *actions* that make sense to children. If the song or activity involves a movement sequence, present each motion individually before putting the motions together. Also, use words that children understand. For example, use "one hand" and "the other hand" rather than "left hand" and "right hand."
